## VICE PRESIDENT (Senior Cricket) 2021 / 2022

Amazingly we managed to get through another season with Covid-19 restrictions coming into play for a second year running. Unfortunately, rounds were interrupted with many clubs having to forfeit their teams in lower grades. However, the weather was kind to us, as opposed to last season, with hardly a day lost because of inclement conditions.

Our Luscombe Shield competition continued to grow in strength with most teams rising to the challenge. Pascoe Vale Central and Buckley Park fought out the best of three grand final for a second year in a row whilst our Kyte Shield grade was also keenly contested. The expectation is that the promoted teams next season will be more than competitive in the Luscombe Shield grade.

The grading and fixturing of our association are always a massive task. New teams and ground availability make it even more difficult. This year team forfeits in lower grades meant team performances in various grades differed greatly from week to week. This situation gave the impression that some teams were incorrectly graded as form fluctuated significantly. It is hoped without a Covid influence there will not be a repeat of this phenomenon next season.

Most of the grades were played in great spirit although player behaviour became an issue as the season progressed. The umpiring fraternity reported a worsening of player conduct and the issue will be addressed in the off season. Of course, clubs will also need to support the association and the umpires as the Code of Conduct becomes a focus for the coming season.

It is worth mentioning again the need for teams to make a much greater effort to register players for finals and to record accurately how a game is played. Much time was given this year to granting player permits and deciphering scorebooks throughout the year. Clubs are duty bound to ensure these items are in order on a regular basis. It is so disappointing for all concerned when a game is decided at Board level rather than on the field of play.

We look forward with confidence to the 2022-2023 season. Hopefully the shape and length of the season will be a return to our usual 2-day and 1-day formats.

As we know, during the 2021 calendar year, Melbourne became the most locked down city in the world with our last lock down ending on the 26<sup>th</sup> October 2021. The impact of the lockdown finally ending, was not just an overall sense of “freedom”, it also meant a mad rush to get the cricket season underway.

I am incredibly proud of the way Clubs and their army of volunteers worked to organise their teams to ensure that games could get underway within weeks of the end of lockdown. We should not underestimate the positive health impact playing cricket provides to our communities.

Our overall competition continues to grow and during this season, we had approximately 500 teams and we saw growth in numbers across the Juniors, Women’s and Men’s grades. With this growth, we now have cricket being played on various days and nights across the week. Moving forward, I can see that we will need to be innovative and adaptive to lifestyle changes to ensure that we provide every opportunity for our communities to play the game we love.

With our 75 clubs, we are one of the largest associations in Metropolitan Melbourne. The workload to manage our association has grown to such an extent, that we decided to engage a full-time employee for the first time in our history.

Bryan McNicol joined us in September 2021, has worked hard with the administration team to keep our competition on the right path, and also focussing on continuous improvement. Thanks for all your hard work Bryan. It’s been great to have you on board.

## VICE PRESIDENT JUNIORS REPORT 2021 / 2022

Firstly, I would like to thank Bob Byron, Bill Maddern, Bryan McNicol and my fellow Board Members Brian Moloney, Sonja Viehl, Shellee Hereora and Bernard Morrow for all their support throughout the season.

In 2021-22, the NWMCA experienced continued growth in player participation in senior and junior competitions. Junior Boys teams totalled 256 across the under 10s, 12s,14s and 16s divisions played on Friday night and Saturday morning competitions. Junior games are played on grounds and supported by the local municipalities of:

- Hume
- Melbourne
- Melton
- Moonee Valley
- Moreland
- Whittlesea

As Junior Vice President I would like to acknowledge and thank all club Junior Coordinators, for the key role you play in your clubs Junior Program and working with us to improve the junior player experience. It was pleasing to see an increase in the number of NWMCA Child Safe clubs in the 2021-22 season.

Ongoing COVID-19 impacts continued to pose challenges to administrators, clubs and players and resulted in a delayed start to our junior season.

Our newly appointed Assistant Administrator Bryan McNicol largely managed all junior boys fixtures, with Bill providing assistance as needed. With the increase in junior boy's teams, Bill and Bryan did an amazing job finding alternative venues when grounds were unavailable or clashes with other junior competitions. We tried a different approach with the under 12s Friday night Competition by trialing grouping of teams based on location to avoid ongoing COVID-19 risks and to reduce travel time to games. Overall, the feedback from the clubs was positive. I would like to thank both Bill and Bryan for their assistance during the season.

In 2021-22 we partnered with Cricket Victoria to create a Junior Director of Coaching role. Dom Sullivan was appointed as the NWMCA Junior Director of Coaching. The primary focus of this role is to support, develop junior coaches and provide an improved coaching experience for junior players. Despite COVID-19 restrictions Dom attended and assisted several Clubs with junior training sessions and delivered a Level One Coaching course for the region. Looking forward to the exciting program of events you have planned for the 2022-23 season.

The NWMCA Junior committee is that group that meets once a month and this season due to ongoing COVID-19 issues, we had more than our usual challenges of grading adjustments, ground shortages, player permits and other issues to ensure junior games are played in the right spirit. I would like to thank Femi Ferzulla, Simon Fitzgerald, Steve Webb for all of their efforts during the year.

### JUNIOR PATHWAY

With nearly 300 junior teams in NWMCA boys' and girls' competitions, representative cricket is a key component of the development pathway of young cricketers. We partner and work with Cricket Victoria, Premier and Sub-District clubs to provide players for their under-age pathways programs.

Each year, the NWMCA enters teams in the Victorian Metropolitan Cricket Union (VMCU) junior carnival. At the 2022 VMCU Carnival, we entered our biggest ever number of teams with 13 boys and 4 girl's representative teams in the various Shields and Cups. It was pleasing to offer 39 extra boys an opportunity to play representative cricket and take part in the CMCU carnival. A special thanks to Steve Webb for coordinating the boy's representative selection trials, appointment of coaches and team managers and ensuring the carnival ran smoothly. It would be remise of me not to mention Bill Maddern and Bryan McNicol for all their assistance with the VMCU carnival. To all our junior players, parents, coaches and team managers for proudly representing the NWMCA at the 2022 VMCU carnival.

Overall, North West Metro had a successful carnival, especially as our girls under 12, under 14 and under 17 teams all played finals. Special mention to our Under 17 girls for winning the Mel Jones Shield and our 14 girls for finishing runners up in the Julie Savage Shield. Congratulations to Sonja and Shellee Hereora (Girls Coordinator) for running a great program and bring home Julie Savage and Mel Jones VMCU Shields this season.

### **AWARD WINNERS**

It was pleasing to celebrate award winners and hold our junior presentation night on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2022. Congratulations to all award winners and thanks to everyone who attended the night.

Finally, kudos to all club administrators, junior coordinators, volunteers, coaches, players and junior parents for getting community clubs through the ongoing impacts of COVID this season.

I would personally like to thank Mick in being a big part of the girl's success in this carnival and he was also great to bounce ideas off.

Our opening batters (Samohn and Claudia) went in to start the chase and not long after Samohn was caught and bowled in the 7th over by the off-spinner Uvindee. At that point we had less than 20 runs on the board. Claudia kept chipping in and played a sensible innings by holding one end against a very disciplined bowling performance from ISECA especially when 2 wickets fell in the span of 2 overs. It looked like it was going to be a tough chase but luckily the rain interfered and stopped the play. The umpire deemed the outfield to be risky and the game got called off.

**Round 3:** Against WRJCA – Western Region Junior Cricket Association (AWAY) Toss won by: WRJCA, Batting First NWMCA

We were asked to put up a total first by WRJCA and our batters did exactly that. We had a huge win against WRJCA after they were outplayed in all departments by our very discipline and fierce players. Samohn again shinning with the bat and forced to retire at 60 runs off 88 balls, a well-supported innings by Georgia Egan (26 off 59) who did the job of the opener after Claudia departed early for only 3 runs. A great cameo from Aarzu who opened quick fire scoring 41 off 47 balls supported by Chelsea who also chipped in with 16 off 26 to set a very competitive total of 197. With the ball, Lily Pelosi was the star of the show after taking 4 wickets off her 6.4 overs giving away only 8 runs. Hannah was also destructive with her 5 overs taking away 2 wickets for the team. There was no hope for the home team to recover when the top wickets were gone too soon. We had a good chance to give the bowlers a good go and tested out a few strategies which was nice. In short, it was a great day at the office!

**Round 4:** Against SECA – South East Cricket Association (AWAY) Toss won by: SECA, Batting First NWMCA

Our batting line-up was once again tested and we delivered. We scored our highest total of 5-203. Our opening batters, Samohn and Claudia complimenting each other beautiful with Samohn being the aggressor (47 off 73) while Claudia (61\* off 126) was happy to rotate the strike and eventually forced to retire giving chance to remaining batters to chip in. Lily, opening quick fire made sure that she capitalised on the batting opportunity that she got scoring 31 runs off 18 balls only! In response, SECA managed to score 6-112 only giving us another hope to play finals. Lily's pure pace was our key weapon against the opposition and she again delivered picking 3 wickets off her 7 overs, 2 maidens and giving away 16 runs. Pure joy to watch!! Aarzu also showed her skill with the ball taking 2 wickets in her 4 overs, 2 maidens and giving away 5 runs only. Ultimately, it was the team effort which took us through to another win.

**Round 5:** Against MPCA – Mornington Peninsula Cricket Association (AWAY) Toss won by: MPCA, Batting First NWMCA

After a long journey to Mornington Peninsula, playing of synthetic wickets, losing the toss and batting first, this was by far the toughest match in the round games. We lost our top 3 batters, all scoring single digits, 12 overs into the innings. The middle and lower order was asked to do all the heavy lifting. Aarzu again stood out with the bat scoring a much needed 26 off 29 and was supported by Hannah Flood (23 off 55) but the highlight performance was Brooke was asked to bat at number 11 for the first time in the carnival and scored a crucial 12 off 34 building a match winning partnership with Lily who also chipped in with her 12 runs off 20 balls. We knew we had to do something special with in the field to defend the 124 runs which at that time we didn't think was enough. The team was pumped up, great unity was demonstrated, good team spirit and wonderful fighting skills saw us take 7 catches, 2 runouts and a stumping which ended the home team's chances for a win against us! Absolutely terrific scenes! All the bowlers chipped in and were disciplined.

Aarzu, Liz and Claudia stood out with 3 wickets for Aarzu and 2 wickets each for Liz and Claudia. This was by far the best match of the carnival, at least for me!

**Semi-final:** Against WRJCA – Western Region Junior Cricket Association (HOME) Toss won by: WRJCA , Batting First NWMCA

We were confident going into the semi-finals knowing that we outplayed WRJCA in the round games. However, we were faced with a slight twist to the story when Lily's parents told us after the 5th round that she will not be available to play SF and GF. This concerned us because she was a crucial part of the winning combination. Nonetheless, we also appreciate that we were not relying on one player as such and that everyone is very much capable of delivering on any given day. The girls valued every opportunity that came their way and played their best game. We were in a good position to bat first because we've had a fair amount of opportunity to test our batting line-up down to the 11th batter! Everyone knew that it took a team effort to be in this position. Samohn started with the bat and again forced to retire at 62 off 111 balls doing the hard work for her team. All the other batters did a wonderful job as usual and chipped in with much needed partnerships to finally put 166 runs on the board, which was a good score to defend. Our bowlers and fielders, at this stage were just showing off their skills. Claudia taking the new ball with Hannah which was a new role for her given that Lily was no longer available to play. Liz being unplayable, taking 3 wickets. Stefania taking 2 wickets for fun, 1 maiden giving away 6 runs, Aarzu and Samohn being right on the money giving the team 1 wicket each, everyone put their hand up and like true champions were able to stick with their plans and execute accordingly which led to another easy win and a spot in the Grand Final. Happy days!

**Grand Final:** Against ISECA – Inner South East CA (Away) Toss won by: NWMCA, Batting First ISECA Coming into the finals, we were slightly nervous because we had a bit of a scare against ISECA and were saved by the rain. ISECA were pretty good with the ball and had a couple of really good batters so we knew it was going to be a tough game to win. It was a good toss to win, we put them ISECA to bat first and our spinners were quickly in action! Our pace and spin bowling attack/combo worked very well in our favour, we were able to put pressure on early. The captaincy and field positions were spot on. Hannah being exceptional with the ball gave us a great start, our quality spinners Claudia and Liz were unplayable, Aarzu, Isobella, Lasharne, Brooke, Stefania and Samohn played their role very well and supported the team by bowling good lines. Our fielding and Keeper (Chelsea) were on fire!! We were able to get all 10 wickets for 112 which was a great thing to do in a final! We went out to chase 112 and were faced with a rocky start, losing Samohn for 7 runs in the 8th Over. Claudia and Georgia played a very mature innings. It took a lot for them to slowly pick up the pace and score some runs, but they kept very patient and persistent. The match winning partnership saw Claudia score 38 off 96 balls and Georgia scoring 39 off 87 not out and a little push from Hannah, Chelsea and Lasharne to seal the deal with 5 overs to spare and win us the trophy.

The highlight for me was that we have a well-rounded team with each individual playing their role to achieve the overall success. Everyone stood up in their own way and played the best cricket that they could give. The captaincy was fantastic, they were ready to listen and understand the plans. The fire and team spirit were evident. We won as a Unit, and I am very proud of this bunch!

Disappointingly, girls had to retire at 60 runs unlike the boys who retired at 100. This deprived some very capable girls from batting longer and achieving the 100 runs milestone. Women's cricket is growing tremendously, U17 girls are no different and they need to learn how to bat longer to be able to make that transition from junior cricket to premier cricket.

Overall, I am thankful for the opportunity that I was given by the VMCU and NWMCA to coach the girls and I hope that I was able to play a small role in your success story as players and as an organisation. I am happy to

see the investment in women's cricket and hopefully lots of those young talents will find their way to the Victorian team, perhaps even the Australian team in the near future!

## **DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING REPORT 2021 /2022**

### **Changes to Laws of Cricket**

There were no amendments to The Laws of Cricket for season 2020/21, however the MCC have published a new edition of the Laws of Cricket with significant changes effective from October 2022.

### **COVID-19 Rules**

The season start was delayed until November and all cricket operated under the Covid rules required by Cricket Victoria. Umpires were required to administer and manage the applicable COVID-19 restrictions.

### **Umpire training**

The Government restrictions applying until mid-November limited pre-season umpire training. Umpires in Under Age grades Junior Grades were most affected: The restrictions on meetings and the sudden start to the season, created difficulty in managing the training of new umpires for Cricket Australia's Umpire accreditation program.

### **Umpire availability**

Sporting organisations reported a serious decline in volunteer participation.

Unavailability of umpires due to COVID isolation issues caused some disruption but it appeared the continual lockdown of Victoria created a general loss of interest in community sports officiating. The sharp decline of umpiring numbers in 2021/22 within NWMCA was more noticeable than in the first season of the pandemic.

The unavailability of umpires for Under-Age grades after the Christmas break was more pronounced than normal, also possibly COVID related?

Senior Grades' appointments were constrained by the lack of umpires resulting in lower grades matches being played without umpires. Luscombe Shield policy is to allocate 2 umpires. This aim could not be fulfilled; the focus changed to provide additional matches in lower grades with an umpire.

Persistent requests from Clubs seeking an umpire in lower Grades could not be met.

Under-Age Grades' matches were generally filled thanks to umpires being prepared to umpire both Friday Night and Saturday morning to cover vacancies.

### **Umpire performance**

Umpires appeared to satisfy the clubs with overall umpire performance. This was a pleasing result given only 1 umpire in Luscombe Shield matches where player expectation is for high performance by umpires, and, in the lower grades where umpires were by necessity appointed to umpire higher grades than previous seasons.

A highlight of season 2021/22 was the overall high level of captains' satisfaction with the umpiring standard in Grand Finals matches.

### **Women's Social T/20 Grades**

Umpires were provided, when possible, to the 6 Grades of Women's Social T/20 Grades. Both senior and junior panel umpires were appointed to Women's matches.

Despite the challenges of rules variations applicable in Women's matches, umpires succeeded in conducting the Women's matches in compliance with Laws & Rules.

## **VMCU Carnival Matches**

NWMCA increased their participation to 14 teams in the VMCU Carnival. This provided a challenge to provide 14 umpires on some days with matches spread across the metropolitan area. Eric Kelly organised the complex task to ensure NWMCA's commitment was met to supply an umpire in every match.

Selected umpires from the Junior panel are invited to officiate in VMCU matches.

David Peers (6), Allan Taylor (6), Charlotte Davitt (5) and Peter Gould (5) filled the most appointments from our panels.

## **Under Age Umpire Award - Terry Scott Medal**

Ryan O'Connor was selected for the Terry Scott Medal, awarded to the umpire adjudged the best Under Age Grades umpire for 2021/22. Ryan umpired 20 matches including the Under 16(1) Friday Night and the Women's Division 1 Grand Finals.

## **"Most improved umpire" Award**

NWMCA Umpires' Association present an award to the Open-Age Grades umpire considered to have the most improved performance as rated by captains over the season.

The award for season 2020 /2021 was presented to **Mark Winkle**.

For 2021 /2022, the award was won by **Srinivasa Kodura**.

## **Player conduct**

Cricket at all levels has instances of poor conduct – NWMCA is not immune to behaviour concerns. It was disturbing to lose umpires mid-season who cited disrespect towards umpires by clubs/players as the major factor to not continue.

The Laws of Cricket and NWMCA Rules legislate against unacceptable misconduct in matches and provide clear penalties for infringements. The NWMCA Tribunal in recent seasons has been particularly strong in support of umpires acting on misbehaviour incidents. Clubs, captains and players must ensure cricket is played to the expected standard of behaviour to avoid imposition of heavy sanctions by the Tribunal and/or NWMCA.

## **Vale – Tony Arcaro**

We were saddened by the sudden passing during the season of senior umpire Tony Arcaro. Tony had been a stalwart for NWMCA umpiring since commencing in season 2014/15 and was a quiet achiever umpiring a large number of games in each of his 8 seasons with NWMCA.

## **Eric Kelly**

Eric Kelly assisted with the administration of our umpire panels.

Eric regularly tested umpires at monthly meetings with presentation of practical examples of match day complexities on Laws & Rules. We owe Eric thanks for his efforts in appointing and changing of the appointments for the VMCU Carnival matches.

## 2021-2022 SEASON LADDER – OPEN AGE





## TREASURER'S REPORT – 2021 / 2022

It is with much pleasure that I submit the Financial Report for Season 2021-2022, inclusive of the Independent Auditor's Report for the year ended 30 June 2021.

At the time of publishing, the Independent Auditor is scheduled to undertake the financial audit for the year ended 30 June 2022 on 14 July 2022, with his report expected shortly thereafter. That report will be made available to all clubs upon receipt and will be published with the Annual Report for Season 2022-2023.

I extend my sincere thanks to all club officials for their continued support and collaboration throughout the season to ensure the effective financial performance of your Association.

Despite the uncertainty and challenges presented to all prior to the commencement of Season 2021-2022, your Association achieved a marginally greater than planned Net Deficit of \$12,444.91. This result includes higher than expected operating costs, especially insurances, pennants and trophies, and VMCU Carnival expenses.

Pleasingly, your Association expected and consequentially managed a record number of team entries across all playing groups and days, which in turn allowed for even better day-to-day management of your Association through the planned appointment of a dedicated, employed administrative resource.

Importantly, your Association continues to maintain an appropriate level of liquidity as reflected by the working capital elements as detailed on the Statement of Financial Position.

Finally, you will note that your Association continues to be in a sound financial position, and, your Board continues to work tirelessly at providing fiscal prudence across all of its activities, as well as identifying value-add services for clubs in the future. To this final point, I extend my sincere thanks to your Association's administrators for their focus, attention to detail, commitment to all stakeholders, diligence and wise counsel.
