PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2022/2023

The Covid-19 virus pandemic impacted our last couple of cricket seasons. Whilst there were still some protocols in place in season 2022-23 it was the weather that had the most influence. Vast amounts of rain across Victoria at season start took its toll on grounds, games and administrators. Fairbairn Park, for example, was out of action before Christmas and a number of teams not only lost access to grounds they also had valuable equipment destroyed or deemed unusable because of flood damage. Subsequently, fixtures had to be reshaped, grounds reallocated and teams given temporary facilities to cope with the situation. Thankfully by seasons end the season reverted back to something approaching normality. There were even three rounds of two day cricket possible at the end of the home and away season.

In reviewing season 2022-23 there were many highlights:

Our T20 competition was bigger and better than ever in terms of the number of competing sides and prize money on offer. A special thanks to Sahara Real Estate for sponsoring that competition. Chargers CC defeated East Coburg CC in a closely fought final.

Gladstone Park CC were promoted to the Luscombe Shield and Stringer Shield grades this year. They managed to have both those teams play off in the grand final in the respective grades. It was quite an amazing achievement and a credit to their players and administrators.

The women's competition continued to grow on a number of different levels. More teams were created and new pathways generated. Congratulations to all involved for their efforts in this area.

Buckley Park CC finally broke a 22 year drought in winning the Luscombe Shield grand final. Raj Sandhu was awarded the Ian McCann medal for being the best player in the Grand Final. The medal is named in honour of Ian McCann, a legend at Pascoe Vale Central CC. Ian's sons, Phil and Paul McCann are still valued members of the Pascoe Vale Central CC.

I would like to extend my thanks to the following people for their efforts in conducting season 2022-23:

Bill Maddern, Bryan McNicol and Bob Byron, our NWMCA administrators, who performed great work in running the association on a day to day basis. They found grounds for teams that were basically homeless for three months and adjusted fixtures to accommodate teams affected by flood damaged grounds. Their work in getting the season up and running cannot be underestimated. Bryan McNicol, who completed his tenure on 31st March, managed to help navigate the association over the last 2 years. Bryan McNicol is a caring and hard working person and we at the NWMCA thank him for his valued contribution.

Sonja Viehl and Shellee Hereora, our administrators of Female cricket, who are to be commended for not only their work at Board level but also for their efforts with the women and girls throughout the season.

Bernard Morrow, our association Treasurer, for his amazing expertise in all matters financial.

Frank Rechichi, the leader of our junior committee, for managing competitions across Friday evenings and Saturday mornings.

Vikkas Dhingra, our Senior Men's Vice President, who was instrumental in setting up our T20 competition this year. It was his first year on the NWMCA board and we, the NWMCA board, welcomed his knowledge and experience in all cricket matters.

All of our association umpires for their adjudicating and commitment to ensuring games were conducted in a proper manner.

Congratulations to all individuals and clubs for their participation in the season and best wishes for season 2023-24.

VICE PRESIDENT JUNIORS REPORT 2022/2023

We again experienced a delay in the season starting, pleasingly not due to COVID but heavy rain which flooded grounds in Moonee Valley, creating its own challenges.

The North West Metro Region experienced a slight decrease in participation rates, reflected by a decrease in the total number of boys teams across junior competitions from 256 teams in 2021-22 to 255 teams this season.

We offered Thursday evening as an option to assist with managing the size of the Under 12s competitions and the weekly challenge faced by our Administrators Bill Madden and Bryan McNicol of putting together the junior fixtures which was also compounded by ground availability.

I expect that junior participation rates and team numbers for our Under 10 age group which was most impacted by COVID in 2019-20 and 2020-21 will increase next season. This is based on increased participants numbers reported in North West Woolworth BLAST program run by our clubs this season, with numbers returning to pre COVID levels of 1350 participants.

As Junior Vice President I would like to thank all our LGA stakeholders for their ongoing support of community cricket and juniors in particular.

I would like to acknowledge and thanks all Club Junior Coordinators, Coaches and helpers for the key role you all play in your clubs' Junior Programs. We will continue to assist us to improve the junior player experience. I am pleased to report due to your efforts, all NWMCA Clubs were Child Safe Clubs in the 2022-23 season.

In 2021-22 we partnered with Cricket Victoria to create a Junior Director of Coaching role. Dom Sullivan was appointed as the NWMCA Junior Director of Coaching. The primary focus of this role is to support, develop junior coaches and provide an improved coaching experience for junior players.

This season Dom arranged and delivered several Level One Community Coaching sessions resulting in more than 50 newly qualified Level One Coaches. I want to personally thank Dom for his contributions as our JDOC over this period.

The NWMCA Junior Committee (NWMCAJC) has primary responsibility for delivering the junior program working with NWMCA Administrators and the Board. This season we welcomed new committee members David Jessop and Srinivasa Koduru to assist with rule reviews, gradings, permit requests and other issues to ensure junior games are played in the right spirit. I would also like to thank ongoing committee members Femi Ferzulla, Simon Fitzgerald, Steve Webb for their support throughout the season.

JUNIOR PATHWAY

Representative cricket is a key component of the development pathway of young cricketers. We partner and work with Cricket Victoria, Premier and Sub-District clubs to provide players for their under-age pathways programs.

Each year, the NWMCA enters boys and girls teams in the Victorian Metropolitan Cricket Union (VMCU) junior carnival. At the 2023 VMCU Carnival, we entered 7 boys representative teams in the various Shields and Cups. Each season we look to improve our North West representative program. This season we ran our nets trials indoors at the CitiPower Centre @ Junction Oval. The feedback received from players and parents was positive and we plan to use it again next season.

A special thanks to Steve Webb for coordinating the boy's representative selection trials, appointment of coaches and team managers and ensuring the carnival ran smoothly. Thanks to Bill and Bryan for managing issues as needed. To all our junior players, parents, coaches and team managers thanks for proudly representing the NWMCA at the 2023 VMCU Carnival.

A special mention and congratulations to our Under 12 Josh Browne Plate team who finished top after qualifying games, making the finals and finishing runners up.

It was pleasing to celebrate award winners and premiership teams at the NWMCA Junior Presentation Night held on 28th March 2023. This season we introduced individual batting, bowling and fielding awards for the best performing players selected in North West representative teams. Wednesday 4th January 2023 NWMCA V's SECA (Blue)

Arrive at Roxburgh Park to an overcast morning with strong winds.

NWMCA won the toss and decided to bowl, after a great start we had them at 2-17 but a 64 run partnership got the game back on an even keel. During the innings the winds increased and with the intermittent drizzle, our fielding slipped and in the end we allowed 31 boundaries. After the 40 overs SECA were 8 – 226, with the pick of the bowlers being Harvey Wood with 1 - 8 off 4 overs and Prabhnoor Bopari 1 – 10 off 4 overs. Our extras totalled 26. You could not fault the boys commitment in trying conditions.

NWMCA's innings started slowly and after the loss of a couple of early wickets we were 3-22, it was tough going as the drizzle was continual and the ball was becoming waterlogged. Connor Portelli and Prabhnoor Boparai put on a 46 run partnership before an unfortunate runout of Prabhnoor. After facing his allotted 60 balls Connor Portelli retired with a very well made 51. The fightback continued with Aarman Virk (37 off 60 balls) and Harvey Wood (18 off 25 balls) getting the score to 171 before Wood was dismissed. In the end the final score was 7 for 182.

Whilst the conditions were not ideal our bowling and fielding at times let us down, if we were able to keep SECA to the same number of boundaries that we scored (SECA 31 boundaries, NWMCA 19 boundaries) we would have gone close to winning the game

Thursday 5th January 2023 NWMCA V's Eastern CA

Arrive at Ferndale Park to a cloudy but dry day, no rain as forecast.

Eastern CA won the toss and elected to field. Our top order batters failed to establish themselves and we were 3 for 19. A slight middle order re guard action got us to 7 for 71 after 20 overs. A 46 run partnership between Arya Gupta and Harvey Wood got the score to 8 for 117 after 30 overs. Losing the remaining two wickets for 16 and we were all out for 133. The disappointing part of this is that we only faced 35 overs and left a lot of runs out on the field, some of the team need to look at taking quick singles and put fielders under pressure.

The Eastern innings started well before H. Wood got the first wicket with 19 runs on the board, after a couple of partnerships Eastern were 4-87 after 22.3 overs. Eastern then cruised past our score and didn't lose another wicket till 144 runs. In the end they finished with 175 runs off their 40 overs.

Besides not setting a foundation at the top of the order and the boys not scoring enough runs our fielding at times let us down today, not sure if the conditions from yesterday took its toll (8 degrees and freezing cold) on the boys but we were not anywhere near our best.

Friday 6th January 2023 NWMCA V's Ringwood CA

Arrived at Roxborough Park to perfect conditions, light winds and no rain forecast.

Ringwood won the toss and elected to bowl. NWMCA got off to fantastic start with a 98 run partnership between C Portelli and A Gupta (40). With Connor reaching 46 N/O off his 60 balls our second wicket wasn't lost until we were 139. A mini collapse of the middle order bought us back to 5 for 159. The team rallied to get to 9-208 off 40 overs.

The Ringwood innings started well getting to 31 before Connor Portelli took the first of his three catches for the match. With bowling that was a bit short and wide Ringwood got to 110 before the loss of their second wicket (the first wicket to Samraat Sharma). Some good bowling to the middle order and they were 5 – 125, whilst the bowling was good and the ground fielding had improved we still dropped a number of chances in the field. Ringwood were 6 – 156 when Samraat's started his second spell where he cleaned up Ringwood to be all out for 169. Samraat ending up with the figures of 4 overs, 5 wickets for 12 runs.

A great win for the boys and an all-round great performance. NWMCA 9 – 208 beat Ringwood CA 10 -169

Sunday 8th January 2023 NWMCA V's DANDENONG DISTRICT CA

Arrived at Roxborough Park to perfect conditions, light winds and a forecast high of 32 degrees.

NWMCA won the toss and elected to bat, losing the first wicket without any runs on the board and the ball moving around Arya. Gupta and Samraat Sharma steadied the ship to be 1 – 20 after 10 overs. With confidence growing the pair put on a great partnership and both retired after 60 balls (Arya 42 and Samraat 40) and with a quick 20 by Ashton Watson we were going nicely. Then we lost our second wicket at 106, our 3rd at 113, our 4th at 113 and our 5th at 119, Viman Fernando came in and played a great innings hitting 41 off 44 and Diesel Fletcher scored 16 off 20. After 40 overs NWMCA finished with 7 – 174.

Dandenong came out strong and were 2 for 39, they stayed around or above the required run rate for most of the innings. NWMCA'S ground fielding was very good and their bowling was tight but the real improvement was in the reduced number of extras (7). With 5 overs to go Dandenong required 25 runs to win with 6 wickets in hand. NWMCA bowled these overs beautifully with 20 of the last 30 balls being either a dot ball or a wicket, in the end NWMCA won by 8 runs in a game that they were always behind in but never gave up on.

Arrive at Batterham Reserve in The Basin to perfect conditions , light winds and 28 degrees.

NWMCA won the toss and elected to bat, after losing our first wicket at 16 Connor Portelli and Diesel Fletcher progressed the score nicely with Diesel scoring 27 and Connor scoring 57 off 60 balls. Our second wicket went down at 99 but we were scoring around 4 runs per over, whilst a number of boundaries were hit, we did miss the quick single or running the first run hard to turn ones into two's. The majority of the team got a start but couldn't up the run rate and we finished our 40 overs with 169.

Ferntree Gully got off to a great start with the two openers scoring over 50 each, they lost their first wicket at 143 and passed our total after 32.4 overs. Overall the team were flat in the field.

Arrive at Eltham North Reserve in Eltham to overcast but cool conditions,

Diamond Valley won the toss and elected to field. Our openers got to 23 after 6 overs before losing a wicket. S. Sharma retired after his 60 balls with 24 runs, Armann Virk then retired after his 60 balls with 52 runs. Harvey Wood was next to be dismissed with 21 off 31 balls, Samuel Gregory and Patrick Rennie both then scored at near a run a ball 41 and 25 respectively before the innings finished at 4-199 off the 40 overs.

In Diamond Valley's innings we opened the bowling with Harvey Wood who dismissed their two main batters for a duck and 2. Whilst they put up a fight our boys were on today, their fielding was fantastic, their bowling was line and length and the pressure they placed on Diamond Valley took its toll with them being bowled all out for 101.

Recommendations

Ideally if carnivals are going to be played using a red kookaburra 142g ball then we should look at using the same ball our North West competitions, the difference in the amount of movement the red kookaburra got compared to the current orange ball used was significant.

A focus on running between wickets and pushing the first run to force the fielder to make an error, too many times I would see a shot played and the batter standing there watching the ball roll towards the boundary only not to go for four, we need to remind the boys that all runs are significant not only boundaries, if the field is spread out look at playing shots where you get one run, turn the strike over.

I know we tried to choose teams earlier this year but were hampered by the floods, more training sessions will be ideal but I have to say that the practice match that we had against Diamond Valley was extremely useful in providing data for the carnival, it also gave the boys an understanding of the quality of opponent they would face. Keeping the practice match for next year would be great.

PRE-TOURNAMENT REPORT

Use of the CA facility for trials was excellent.

Initial allocation of Overland #2 was not a good fit for the top age group team, with players who are already experiencing some higher-grade club cricket.

Reallocation to Ormond Reserve, Moonee Ponds was a better outcome. Although this turf wicket oval is too small for U18s rep cricket.

Weather impacts, significantly:

- reduced access to outdoor training
- affected final squad selection, because neighbouring regions were able to move quicker for their squad announcements. FYI - other regions are headhunting players!

TOURNAMENT REPORT

Game 1: Verses Mornington Peninsula CA at Jubilee Oval, Frankston Peninsula.

Oval: Excellent wicket and outfield (9/10). two synthetic nets available. Good sized oval.

Facilities: Good pavilion and facilities (7/10), with air-conditioned room available for spectators. Excellent indoor space for scorers. Umpires had their own room. Non-batting players had shelter. With both ovals concurrently being used there were not enough change rooms. Resulting in the need for both age group teams to share a change room. This should be overcome in future years because this premier league venue has secured further funding for a better and larger pavilion to service three ovals.

Game Summary: NWMCA batted first. Rain interruptions significantly affected the wicket. Game length reduced. Clearing afternoon weather and drying wicket significantly benefitted the team batting second. NWMCA bowling quality was variable.

Standout performances: Arnav Bhatia - batting award, Mitchell Higgs - bowling award. Notable mention - Ethan (fielding, bowling)

Coach's comments: Batter's impatient, not seeking singles. Instead, consistent bowling to 7/2 or 6/3 field settings enabled the opposition to restrict our innings. Bowling was generally good at key moments. Team held their catches. Team spirit in the field was excellent. This spirit nearly won us the game and helped lift the bowlers as the game progressed.

Summary: Good start to the tournament, squad bonding well, an extra 20 runs would have won us the game.

Game 2: Verses Casey Cardinia CA at Ormond Reserve, Moonee Ponds.

Oval: Average wicket, poor outfield (4/10), two synthetic nets available. The wicket was patchy and without any covers being used, was soft. Lots of rolling done before game was done. Ball stayed very low throughout game. Oval too small.

Facilities: Excellent pavilion and facilities (8/10), with air-conditioned room available for spectators. Excellent indoor space for scorers. Umpires had their own room. Soft drinks. tea/coffee and dim sims available from the pavilion. Team Manager organised for players to enjoy free dim sims at lunch. On-site staff present.

Game Summary: NWMCA batted first. Another poor start, again the opposition is adept at bowling consistently to 7/2 or 6/3 field settings. More so than NWMCA bowlers. However, NWMCA were unlucky, many deliveries beat the bat, some edges didn't carry, a couple of dropped catches.

Standout performances: Zac Graham - batting award. Mitchell Higgs - bowling award. Notable mention - Logan Valentine (wk)

Coach's comments: Again top-order impatient, not seeking singles. One of the opening bowlers was not consistent, runs scored quickly against us at start of game. On-field leadership dropped off during game, picked up after coach intervened during drinks break.

Summary: Top order batters not scoring runs was biggest issue. Zac held the innings together. Mitchell Higgs showing his worth as a consistent bowler, Cooper very inconsistent, others OK. Not having a good spin bowler hurt us. Lads not using their slower deliveries enough. We need to lift for the 3rd game! (note: offer some optional weekend training)

Game 3: Verses Diamond Valley at Binnak Park, Watsonia.

Oval: Good wicket and outfield (8/10). Three synthetic nets available. Good sized oval. Newly developed oval and facility

Facilities: Excellent pavilion and facilities (9/10), with air-conditioned room available for spectators. Excellent indoor space for scorers. Umpires had their own room. Paval Florin present, the European cricket personality. People attending appreciated his presence. NWMCA should contact Melbourne Stars (I think Paval is getting some funding from the Stars to promote cricket?)

Game Summary: NWMCA batted first. Another poor start, but lads dug in and batted out their 45 overs. Once again Zac Graham saved the innings with a strong performance. We again faced a team that was very capable of bowling to their 7/2 or 6/3 field. Team demonstrated more batting patience, a good step in the right direction. Our bowling also had more consistency, although one or two were still a bit loose (Cooper and Riley).

Standout performances: Zac Graham - batting award. Willem Christian - bowling award. Notable mention - Mitchell Higgs (batting).

Coach's comments: Best batting performance so far, Zac again holding the innings together. Mitchell Higgs emerging as a good all-rounder. Luke and Cooper had soft tissue injuries, so had to be carefully managed with limited bowling. Ethan bowled well and was the standout fielder. This game had a similar feel to the first game. Team spirit was strong and put pressure on the opposition when bowling. Reckon we would have run with 20 more runs on our total.

Summary: We lifted! Made a few changes that seemed to work. Mixed up the top order for this game, Logan performed better down the order, Willem looked good as a pinch hitter but stepped onto his stumps early in the innings. Whilst Oscar is captain, Damien is emerging as the on-field leader. Again, not having a good spin bowler is hurting us. Only Mitchell and Ethan bowling with good slower balls. Overall, a good performance, the 1%ers let us down again ... patience, searching for singles, more confident calling when batting. Had a non-compulsory training session before this game. Willem responded well to feedback for standing tall and using his presence at the top-of-runup. Was very rewarding to see him blossom in this game.

Game 4: Verses Western CA at Ormond Park, Moonee Valley.

Oval: Average wicket although drying wicket made slightly better than 1st home game, poor outfield (5/10), two synthetic nets available. The wicket was harder, lots of rolling done before game. Again the ball stayed very low throughout game. Oval too small.

Facilities: Excellent pavilion and facilities (8/10), with air-conditioned room available for spectators. Excellent indoor space for scorers. Umpires had their own room. Soft drinks. tea/coffee and dim sims available from the pavilion. Team Manager organised for players to enjoy free dim sims at lunch. On-site staff present.

Game Summary: NWMCA batted first. Another poor start, again the opposition is adept at bowling consistently to 7/2 or 6/3 field settings. Zac again batted well, Ethan batted well, ran out of partners. Some very poor umpiring decisions on LBW (Damien) and run-outs (Zac) hurt us! NWMCA bowlers started well, with an early dropped catch. A poor umpiring decision for a catch (Ethan) hurt us again. Team lifted after lunch. Team seems to be listening to their VC (Damien) more than Captain (Oscar).

Standout performances: Zac Graham - batting award. Willem Christian - bowling award. Notable mention - Ethan (fielding) and Damien (leadership).

Coach's comments: Top order failed again. Were better at seeking singles, much better run-rate. Some very poor umpiring decisions went against us, even the opposition made comment on this! The umpires report for this game gives more detail.

Summary: Top order batters not scoring runs was the biggest issue again! Zac held the innings together. Started off with strong intent when bowling, early wickets fell. Team seemed to drop their spirits when an umpiring decision went against them. Use of part-time spin bowlers once again did not work, lack of slow-bowling consistency and a low total worked against us.

MCC published a new edition of the Laws of Cricket with several significant changes effective from October 2022. Instruction to all NWMCA umpires caused few problems arising from several complex changes to cricket's Laws

COVID-19 Rules

Covid-19 rules remained applicable in Victoria, but the enforced restrictions were generally relaxed as the season progressed.

Umpire availability

Following the Covid lockdowns, all organisations reported a serious decline in the participation of volunteers returning. Most sports lost officials, and NWMCA was no exception with umpire numbers.

The Junior umpires panel bolstered numbers with new applicants, but the number of Senior umpires deteriorated, as experienced each season since March 2020.

The inability to provide umpires increased the number of Saturday matches with no umpire appointed.

Altogether a very disappointing and serious situation for NWMCA cricket.

Umpire performance

The loss of, or, the unavailability of several senior umpires weakened the standard of umpiring provided to Clubs. However, captains were generally happy with umpire performance. Such a result was a credit to the umpires appointed to higher levels than previously experienced.

A highlight of season 2022/23 was the overall high level of captains' satisfaction with the umpiring standard in Grand Finals matches.

Women's Social T/20 Grades

Umpires were provided, when possible, to the 7 Grades of Women's Social T/20 Grades. Both senior and junior panel umpires were appointed to Women's matches.

Under Age Umpire Award - Terry Scott Medal

Mathieson King, a first-year umpire, was awarded the Terry Scott Medal, awarded to the best Under Age Grades umpire for 2022/23.

Mathieson umpired regularly, was appointed, based on consistent reports submitted by coaches, to the Under 16 (1) Friday Grand Final. In addition, he umpired 6 matches in the VMCU Carnival in January.

“Most improved umpire” Award

NWMCA Umpires’ Association present an award to the Open-Age Grades umpire considered to have the most improved performance as rated by captains over the season. For 2022/23, the award was won by **Alex Lugli**.

VMCU Carnival Matches

A major change in the VMCU competition was to allow Associations to appoint both umpires for “home” Association’s matches. This positively reduced travelling for umpires and provided more umpires able to umpire.

Selected umpires from the Junior panel are invited to officiate in VMCU matches.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with much pleasure that I submit the Financial Report for Season 2022-2023, inclusive of the Independent Auditor's Report for the year ended 30 June 2022.

At the time of publishing, the Independent Auditor is scheduled to undertake the financial audit for the year ended 30 June 2023 on 20 July 2023, with his report expected shortly thereafter. That report will be made available to all clubs upon receipt and will be published with the Annual Report for Season 2023-2024.

I extend my sincere thanks to all club officials for their continued support and collaboration throughout the season to ensure the effective financial performance of your Association.

I am pleased to advise your Association achieved a marginally greater than planned Net Surplus of \$8,842.76. This result was primarily due to increased corporate sponsorship and penalties imposed on clubs, the latter being income your Association does not plan for nor seeks to rely upon.

The non-merchandising cost base of your Association experienced price increases in line with expectations, whilst significant planning and some cash reserves was dedicated to future merchandising requirements in anticipation of continued price increases over the coming period through end-2024. Consequently, inventories as at 30 June 2023 are larger than typical, but are as intended in order to provide a basis of fiscal support to all clubs in the coming financial year.

Further, in anticipation of the technology changes associated with the implementation of PlayHQ to replace MyCricket, combined with your Association's office technology being passed its intended useful life, significant investment in new information technology was completed in the current financial year.

Importantly, your Association continues to maintain an appropriate level of liquidity as reflected by the working capital elements as detailed on the Statement of Financial Position.

Finally, you will note that your Association continues to be in a sound financial position, and, your Board continues to work tirelessly at providing fiscal prudence across all of its activities, as well as identifying value-add services for clubs in the future. To this final point, I extend my sincere thanks to your Association's administrators for their focus, attention to detail, commitment to all stakeholders, diligence and wise counsel.
