VICE PRESIDENT JUNIORS REPORT 2020-2021

Firstly, I would like to thank Bob Byron, Bill Maddern and my fellow Board Members Brian Moloney, Sonja Viehl, Allan Taylor and Bernard Morrow for all their support in my 1st year as Vice President Juniors.

The North West Metropolitan Cricket Association (NWMCA) is the second largest community cricket association in metropolitan Melbourne. We are the only association that offers competitions across junior boys, junior girls, senior men and senior women.

The emergence of COVID-19 posed significant challenges to administrators, clubs and players in the lead up to the season, and at the time posed a real risk that community cricket would not go ahead due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In the end the season start was delayed and COVID-19 safe training and match days protocols were developed and put in place to ensure games could be played. State Government financial grants to associations and clubs, combined with fee relief from local councils and support from Cricket Victoria and the VMCU assisted community cricket to grow participation rates despite COVID-19.

As Junior Vice President I would like to acknowledge and thank all club Junior Coordinators, for the key role you play in your clubs Junior Program and working with us to improve the junior player experience.

Again the NWMCA had a very strong under 10 program, largely due to Charlie Walker who manages and looks after all the fixturing of the competition. Our Friday night boys of Under12s, 14s and 16s competition continue to grow and is causing fixture issues due to lack of grounds and clashes with other junior competitions. Bill Maddern does an amazing job finding alternative venues.

It is fantastic to see girls cricket continue to grow, the number of girls teams increased by 25% this season, credit to Sonja and her hard working Female Committee.

The NWMCA Junior committee is that group that meets once a month and this season due to COVID-19 we had more than our usual challenges of grading adjustments, ground shortages, player permits and other issues to ensure junior games are played in the right spirit. I would like to thank Femi Ferzulla, Simon Fitzgerald, Steve Webb for their efforts during the year. Charlie has advised that he will not be continuing in this role. I would like to thank Charlie for his service of over 20 years as a junior committee member and for all his assistance to me in my role.

AWARD WINNERS

It was pleasing to celebrate award winners and hold our junior awards night which was cancelled in 2019-20 due to Covid 19. Congratulations to all of this year's winners.

JUNIOR PATHWAY

With 280 plus junior teams in NWMCA boys and girls competitions, representative cricket is a key component of the development pathway of young cricketers. We work with Premier and Sub-District clubs to provide players for their under-age pathways programs.

Each year, the NWMCA enters teams in the Victorian Metropolitan Cricket Union (VMCU) junior carnival. At the 2021 VMCU Carnival, 13 representative teams competed in the various Shields and Cups.

2021 VMCU CRICKET CARNIVAL – JANUARY 2021

U12 KEITH MITCHELL SHIELD

Introduction

Limited preparation due to COVID-19

Relatively young squad, both in terms of age (3 bottom age players) and experience

11 player squad – good match opportunity for all players

Match 1: vs Inner South East at home - NWMCA 10/60 vs Inner SE 10/117

- Match result heavily influenced by weather
- Reduced over match (32 a side) due to rain delay
- Lost toss and sent in on wet pitch
- 4/9 after 3 overs and 6/16 after 7 overs
- First 7 batsmen bowled
- 10/60 after 18 overs
- Inner SE 10/117 after 25 overs

Best performances:

- BAT: 30 run 8th wicket partnership between Campbell B (15 off 25) and Chirag M (13 off 32)
- BOWLING: Rishi D 5 for 9 off 3.3 overs
- FIELDING: Solid all round effort in wet conditions

Match 2: vs Ferntree Gully away – FGCA 5/190 vs NWMCA 9/137

- Played full game but in wet conditions
- After 30 overs FGCA 4/118 but finished at 5/190
- A lot of misfielding (particularly in last 10 overs)
- Put under pressure by aggressive running between wickets by FGCA and lacked a bit of composure
- Solid batting – 6 players faced 20 balls or more
- Lost 5 wickets in overs 26 to 30
- But batted out the last 10 overs Archer L (63 off 96) and Issam S (10 off 23)

Best performances:

- BAT: Archer L 63 off 96, Campbell Byers 15 off 22
- BOWLING: Chirag M 5 overs 2 for 15, and Christian L 4 overs 0 for 9
- FIELDING: Run outs to Rishi D and Campbell B

Match 3: vs Western Region JCA away – WRJCA 3/201 vs NWMCA 9/136

- Played a big and experienced WRJCA team
- After 20 overs WRJCA 0 for 82 – after 40 3/201
- Better effort in field and consistent bowling effort
- Good effort with bat at top of order (58 for 3 after 20 overs) but lost wickets in the middle – good effort then to bat through the overs

Best performances:

- BAT: Rishi D 47 off 72, and Chirag M 40 off 31
- BOWLING: Ruben P 4 overs 0 for 14, Harry M 2 overs 0 for 1
- FIELDING: Nicanor M good effort WK and excellent catch in slips, Rishi D with a catch and very good ground fielding

Match 4: vs SECA at home – SECA 5/216 vs NWMCA 10/80

- Played a very good SECA team
- Took early wickets but not able to break some big partnerships in the middle
- Poor start to the run chase 3 for 4 after 3 overs with batsmen 2, 3 and 4 getting ducks
- Dug in to get to 80 off 27 overs with Nicanor M batting through at 1 and 33 run partnership for 7th wicket between Archer L and Harry M

Best performances:

- BAT: Nicanor M 25 no off 60, Archer L 16 off 17, and Harry M 16 off 41
- BOWLING: Christian L 6 overs 1 for 22, and Rishi D 6 overs 1 for 18
- FIELDING: All round effort – concentration and skills improving

Match 5: vs Ringwood DCA away – RDCA 5/227 vs NWMCA 6/131

- Shortened match (30 overs a side) due to heat
- Bowling OK but aggressive batting by RDCA and we dropped around 7 catches
- Changed the batting order to give more opportunity to players who had batted lower in earlier games
- Good solid effort up top (1 for 42 off 10 overs) but 5 for 71 off 20
- Excellent catch in slips by Archer L

Best performances:

- BAT: Issam S 23 off 37, Oscar M 24 no off 48, and Harry M 21 off 40
- BOWLING: Issam S 3 overs 0 for 17, Chirag M 3 overs 1 for 14
- FIELDING: Good catches by Archer L and Issam S, good voice in field late in innings by Harry M

Match 6: vs Dandenong DCA at home – NWMCA 10/148 vs DDCA 9/210

- Best round match of the carnival for NWMCA
- Improved intensity around scoring and running between wickets
- Good effort in the field – good energy, voice, and enthusiasm
- Good catching effort – slips catches to Archer L and Rishi D
- Best opening partnership (29 runs) of carnival

Best performances:

- BAT: Issam S 38 off 63, Nicanor M 18 off 31
- BOWLING: Issam S 6 overs 2 for 16, Ruben P 3 overs 2 for 21
- FIELDING: Slips catches to Archer L and Rishi D, good all-round fielding effort by Oscar M

Closing Comments

- Policy of giving everyone opportunity for success
- Continued improvement throughout carnival from all players individually and as a team
- Good team harmony and a supportive parent group
- Very positive experience for all

Batting

- Batted out all overs except 1st game in rain and against SECA (27 overs all out)
- Showed good patience with the bat with 6 players reaching 40 balls faced in at least one innings and someone batting 60 balls (retired) in 4 of 6 matches (and Oscar with a 48 ball innings (max 50) in another
- But our run rate over the carnival was 3.5 an over (692r/195o), compared to our opposition 5.4 (1161r/215o)
- Partly due to our lack of intensity running between wickets compared to other teams

Bowling/Fielding

- Also a lack of calmness in the field when put under pressure
- Inability to bowl teams out – NWMCA 37 wickets in 6 games, opposition 54 wickets
- Some excellent fielders - Rishi, Nicanor, Campbell, Oscar, Issam
- Our 3 bottom age players Rishi, Christian and James showed real promise with the ball

Assistant Coach Statement (Robbie Ibrahim)

As we know preparation is key for anything we do in life. So, just to add to the parent feedback, I would say an earlier start in the process would be ideal (pending COVID restrictions). Even as early as September if possible.

The kids bonded, performed admirably, showed resilience and skill throughout. However, the running between wickets, missed runouts and catches hurt as we kept searching for that elusive victory. This is just around the corner if we can correct those key elements.

40 Overs is a big jump from club cricket (20-25 overs), so the mental aspect is critical. Preparing the boys for this, especially the 2nd half of the innings where fatigue sets in, was no doubt a challenge!

I must say, you could not have found a better coach in Andrew Martel for the boys. He was calm, fair and always positive. He constantly encouraged the boys and ensured that their development was always at the top of his agenda. Well Done Andrew!

So much to gain from this year as we attempt to prepare the boys better for their next journey.

Team Manager Statement (Sami Babar)

It was a great effort, especially from Andrew after the team selection. No doubt the kids showed a lot of courage, fight and character but it was not easy for them. And I felt proud to be a part of the team.

U12 JOSH BROWN PLATE

After picking the team, following the trials, my main objective for the carnival was for all the boys to get as many opportunities as possible and to have fun. I was of the opinion that there were no superstars in the team so I was not focused on results. The focus was more on individual development and team spirit.

Round 1 NWMCA 8/117 def Ringwood 2/107

We bowled first and it was a well-disciplined bowling and fielding display. We hit our lengths really well and fielded really well. Mason Maddern picked up 4 wickets, 3 of which were bowled. The chase was a tough grind with Mitchell Taylor working hard for 12 off his 60 balls and Oskar Kline getting 28. This gave us some momentum when we really needed it.

Round 2 NWMCA 8/157 drew Inner South East 6/86

Unfortunately, the game was abandoned due to rain when we were in a really strong position to win the game. Batting first we made 157 with Lucas Bellino hitting 35 off his max 60 balls and Harry Bikakis' 19 was an entertaining innings. Bowling was particularly difficult later in the innings with the boys struggling to grip the slippery ball. Emile Lewis did well picking up 2 wickets

Round 3 NWMCA 79 lost to Ringwood (1) 6/139

We were comprehensively beaten in this game by a pretty talented team. We batted first and were dismissed for 79 runs. The bowling of Ringwood was of a very high standard, way stronger than most Mitchell shield sides I have seen over the years. One pleasing aspect was that 3 of the boys were able to survive for 30 plus balls. Oscar Kline scoring 17, Neal Rao got 13 and although Archie Pearce only scored 4 he opened against some high quality bowling and got through 30 balls. Ringwood passed us comfortably with one kid dominating who was a class above this level. I elected to keep playing after they passed us to give all the boys 2 overs. We ended up getting 6 wickets and I think the boys realised that if they were able to get the 2 openers out then there was not actually much quality batting to come. No great highlights with the bowling just a steady effort.

Round 4 NWMCA 140 lost to Melton junior CA 163

This was a game that we probably let slip after bowling well early. We bowled a few too many four balls and probably let them get 30 more runs than they should have. Emile Lewis was the pick of the bowlers with 3 for 11 off 5 overs. We had good early momentum in our run chase but lost our way midway through the innings and ultimately fell 23 runs short. Highlights of the batting were Oscar Kline scoring 34 off 63 balls whilst Mason Maddern made a well compiled 21 off 27 balls.

Round 5 NWMCA 112 lost to Box Hill Reporter 6/154

This was a 30 over game due to the heat and I thought the scores gave a pretty good indication of where the 2 teams were at. They had some quality batters and good consistent bowlers but to our credit we were still competitive. There were no specific highlights with the ball, just an all-round steady effort. I asked Mason Maddern to open the batting and despite his nerves he did a wonderful job and retired not out on 23 whilst Issac Minchin batted really well for 19.

Round 6 NWMCA 119 lost to SECA 8/24

Up against the all-conquering SECA in our final game of the carnival was a challenge that the boys were looking forward to and I thought they were terrific. Our fielding and concentration in the field was fantastic with Archie Pearce taking a couple of great catches and nearly pulled off a great run out. Emile Lewis kept getting better with each game rattling the stumps early whilst Mason was rewarded for his consistency with a couple of wickets. Unfortunately, only 3 of our boys got going with the bat with Lucas Bellino getting a quick fire 30 whilst Oscar Kline got 29 and Issac Minchin was terrific with 35 off 62 balls.

Summary

In summary the tournament was a raging success for our team, the boys had a lot of fun, had great team spirit and played some really good cricket. We had moderate success, winning one game, robbed of another due to weather, not far away in 2 losses and comfortably beaten in 2 others.

As I said to my team at the start of the tournament I was not focused on wins and losses but more in their development and giving them all opportunities with both the bat and ball. We bowled all 11 bowlers in every game whilst the opposition only bowled 7 and 8. We also changed our batting line up every day to try to provide as many opportunities as possible.

This group of lads was an absolute pleasure to coach and all the parents were fantastic and supportive and we were all on the same page. I think all the boys will benefit greatly from this experience and it will whet their appetite to keep improving.

Game 2 – NWMCA (74) lost to Diamond Valley (8/161) at Coventry Oval in Diamond Creek

After the disappointment of being washed out the day before the boys were hopeful of being able to play their first game, although the weather was overcast and the rain had been light early on. Diamond Valley won the toss and batted first.

Our opening bowlers of Piyush Pemmaraju and Aarav Saxena did a fabulous job early in trying slippery conditions for bowling. Unfortunately, the two openers put on a 79 run partnership, but once they were gone our bowlers did well with three quick wickets. Diamond Valley reached 8-161 off their 40 overs. Best bowlers were Piyush Pemmaraju who bowled 8 overs for only 16 runs and unluckily didn't get a wicket. Aarav Saxena, Tom Answerth and our gun spinner Kanav Sharma did the damage taking 2 wickets each.

The boys thought the target was achievable however quickly found themselves 4/18 after a top order collapse, and we were all out for just 74. Eiron Galpaya protected his wicket and scored 9 runs off 62 deliveries, and Tom Answerth 9 off 24. Sadly the intent to score was lacking with the bat as they were a bit shell-shocked. Aarav Saxena was the only standout with the bat getting 27 runs off 48.

We were bowled out for 79 in just the 33rd over.

Whilst up against it the bowlers tried hard and the fielding was magnificent and the team really put the pressure on Ringwood and had them 4-57 but they eventually cruised to victory.

Josh Whitfield took the catch of the tournament with an incredible one handed catch at full stretch while running back towards the boundary line.

It was an even bowling performance but Kanav Sharma did well with 2 for 7 and Josh Whitfield was good with 1 for 15.

Aarav Saxena was awarded 3 votes by the umpires as the standout player due to his terrific effort when batting.

Game 4 - Away Game vs Western Region Junior

Venue Wyndamvale South Reserve

This game was supposed to be on turf but the council or club had left the sprinklers on overnight so we played on the adjoining synthetic ground.

We batted first and were hoping to put the poor effort the previous day behind us, but sadly this was the worst batting effort of the carnival and by some margin.

The game started half an hour early due to hot temperatures and was reduced to 30 overs.

The boys got off to a slow beginning and things only got worse from there.

The intent to score during this reduced over match was extremely poor and at one point in the innings 4 batsmen had soaked up 119 deliveries whilst scoring only 8 runs. That was two thirds of the innings gone for only 8 runs. Matches cannot be won batting like that. Kallan Rogers and Aarav Saxena did the best of the batsmen that scored at a decent rate. Eiron Galpaya top scored with 13 off 47. He was rewarded with one vote in the umpires votes.

The task ahead of the boys was huge and whilst they tried hard the opposition batting line up was too strong and cruised to victory. This team ended up making the Grand Final so it was always going to be a battle after such a poor batting display.

Josh Whitfield and Piyush Pemmaraju were the pick of the bowlers but the game was over after just 13.1 overs.

After the game the coach really pointed out that the slow batting was not good enough and they need to take the game on. He challenged them to do that in their final game the next day.

Game 5 - Home game vs SECA (Venue JJ Holland Reserve, Kensington - Synthetic Pitch)

The game was played at this oval as it was a far better cricket ground than the one at Strathnaver Reserve in Strathmore.

The boys knew SECA would be a tough game as they are always a strong squad year after year.

The opposition won the toss and sent us in which was understandable if they'd seen our previous batting efforts. The boys were challenged to bat with intent to score and back in their abilities.

Their bowling attack was too good and we were skittled for 54 runs after just 30.5 overs. Even so the scoring rate was not very strong yet again.

Julian Dleski battled hard and got 9 off 65, Eiron 14 off 24 and Piyush 11 off 21 balls.

The rest of the team were in single figures.

To the boys absolute credit they could've hung their heads low and just gone out there and let the game inevitably unfold, but they had a real crack and had the SECA team at 5-11. Unfortunately after a lunch break SECA steadied and made the runs. Piyush Pemmaraju was the pick of the bowlers taking 2 for 4 off 6 overs. Josh Whitfield and Abhayjeet Singh were outstanding too.

Piyush Pemmaraju again got one vote from umpires in the umpires votes. He was clearly the standout player in our squad for this tournament. Congratulations Piyush.

Summary

That concluded the boys tournament and they still enjoyed their time together despite not getting a win on the board.

Early in the tournament I felt the team chemistry wasn't quite as close as previous years and I think this was a result of not having the boys play lead up matches in December. By the end though they were terrific with one another and I'm sure many friendships have been formed for years to come.

It was noticeable to coaches and parents alike that the other cricket associations we played against had far better facilities/grounds than what we had for our home matches.

I really hope this is looked at in the future and extra pressure is put on the clubs with bigger, better grounds to assist the development of junior cricket by letting our rep teams play on their ovals.

Thanks to coach Craig and assistant coach Damian for all their hard work throughout the tournament and to Steve Webb for his tireless behind the scenes work trying to get access to grounds at short notice due to rain effected pitches early on in the tournament.

There is no doubt that we also lost a lot of potential talent that could have represented the NWMCA, but they instead chose to play JC Craig Shield instead.

Look forward to it all again in 2022.

However, it was extremely impressive to see the attitude of the team and their continued fight on the contest. We went out to bowl full of enthusiasm and good energy. This only increased when Xavier Webb made an extremely sharp run out to get Eastern CA 1 for 1. Eastern then began to chip away at our total. That was until Isaac took 2 wickets in a row leaving Eastern 3-33 and more importantly keeping us in the game. Gurvir then struck soon after putting Eastern at 4-38. This put everyone watching on the edge of their seats. Soon after Rikard Friedrich took our 5th wicket and then Heshitha got our 6th with a great runout. Eastern were on 46 runs.

25 YEARS OF SERVICES – THANK YOU GEOFF LAW

After 25 years of cricket service, Geoff Law is passing the baton and stepping back to smell the roses.

Geoff has been involved with the West Coburg Cricket Club for 25 years – the first 8 years as a junior coach, 3 years as Junior Coordinator and the past 14 years as Secretary.

Mixed in there were 11 years as Milo Coordinator introducing boys and girls aged 5 – 8 years old to cricket, coach of their senior women’s team in their inaugural (Premiership) year, helping with junior girls’ cricket, organising school clinics for boys and girls in local primary schools for over 15 years and other odd jobs in the canteen, bar etc.

Brooke Mezzetta, who was Moreland Council’s Women in Sport Coordinator, nominated Geoff to be a White Ribbon Ambassador back in 2014 and he served in this role until White Ribbon Australia went into receivership. This gave him the opportunity to speak to boys and girls at schools and to cricket club members about ending violence and abuse against women and girls and to promote gender equality.

He has watched West Coburg CC grow from 4 senior teams and 4 junior teams (principally male at that stage) 25 years ago to now have 23 teams - 7 senior teams including a senior women’s team, 11 junior mixed teams, 5 junior all girls teams and a Junior Blaster Program that sees 50 – 60, 5 to 7-year-old boys and girls that now sees girls and women have the same pathway into cricket that boys have always had.

Geoff played cricket for Tullamarine Cricket Club for 16 years until the end of the 1985/86 season where he also coached juniors, and served as Vice President, captain and was on the Social Committee.

Geoff is fortunate to be a Life Member of both clubs.

Geoff said he has loved every minute of his time involved with cricket and providing the opportunity for members of the diverse Moreland community to come together in a welcoming and inclusive club in the spirit of sport.

To recognise Geoff Law’s outstanding contribution to our cricket community, the North West Metropolitan Cricket Association has named the Female Social T20 Division 1 in his honour, Women’s Social “Geoff Law Shield”.

VMCU U12 CLAUDIA FATONE SHIELD ROOKIES COACH'S REPORT

As the 2020/21 cricket season approached, we were amidst a global pandemic that was providing a lot of uncertainty. Nevertheless, there was a commitment to continue the growth of the NMWCA junior representative program, although with a few adjustments. Information sessions were conducted via "Zoom" and training was online as we navigated our way through lockdowns, travel and group gathering restrictions as well as adhering to new Covid 19 policies. However, one thing that was certain, with the growth of female cricket in the North West, there was no shortage of talent. After months of preparation, 10 enthusiastic girls were selected to represent "U12 Rookies" in the Claudia Fatone Shield.

After weeks of training, our final session was a practice match against our other NWMCA team on Saturday 2nd January. This was followed by a Cap Presentation which included naming Morgan as Captain and Molly as Vice-Captain. Finally, we were ready for competition.

On Monday 4th January, our campaign began at Chadstone against Inner South East Cricket Association (ISECA). There was a lot of excitement, enthusiasm, and nervousness, but unfortunately the weather wasn't very kind. The match was abandoned due to rain without a ball from being bowled. Whilst it was disappointing to start this way, nothing would dampen the spirits of this team.

Although the rain continued Tuesday, with some sawdust and sweeping of the pitch, the game commenced against Box Hill District (BHDCA) on our Home ground in Oak Park. We won the toss and bowled first. With some tight bowling and some exceptional fielding that included two runouts, we were able to restrict BHDCA to 7/104 from 30 overs. The wickets were shared amongst Holly (2/8), Molly (1/7), Tahlia (1/10) and Morgan (1/13). We set ourselves to win and got off to a great start with Zoe opening the batting and leading the way with 14. She was well supported by Tahlia, Morgan and Adelaide who showed great resistance. Some big hitting from Holly gave us a chance but unfortunately, we were bowled out for 58 in 19 overs with Holly named 'fielder' of the day.

Our next assignment was a trip to Ferntree Gully to play against Ferntree Gully District Cricket Association (FGDCA). It was an exciting morning as we started the day with special guest coach Cathryn Fitzpatrick, with the former Australian player leading the warmup. We bowled first and restricted FGDCA to 6/81 (30 overs). Wickets were shared amongst Morgan (1/5), Molly (1/6), Ava (1/6), Dot (1/9) and Adelaide (1/7) with a Run Out to Zoe. When it was our turn to bat, we got off to a solid start with Brooke, Dot and Tahlia all batting to retirement. Disappointingly, we had a couple of unlucky run outs that halted our momentum and we were bowled out for 48 in 18 Overs. With our first catch for the tournament, Molly was awarded the fielding award.

Thursday saw us return to Chadstone to replay our Round 1 Match. An experienced ISECA team batted first and made 3/207 (30 overs). The bowlers tried hard without luck and Molly (2/16) and Holly (1/26) were our best. It was always going to be a challenging run chase and while we didn't get close to our opposition's score, there were many positives that came out of the game. We were able to score 100 runs for the first time, we batted all our overs and Molly (18), Zoe (17) and Tahlia (14no) achieved personal bests. Further to this, after some outstanding fielding efforts, Tahlia was awarded the fielding efforts

We finished the week returning to Oak Park to take on Ringwood District (RD). For the first time for the week we bowled a side out, restricting RD to 112. Morgan (1/7), Tahlia (1/19), Molly (1/17), Zoe (1/7) and Harmony (1/13) were the wicket takers. Unfortunately, the excitement of this achievement was too much, and we struggled to form any batting partnerships and we were bowled out for 25. Adelaide (7) and Holly (8) tried hard, but we were no match for our stronger opponents. With 2 catches and 2 Run Outs, Holly was awarded the best Fielder award.

Predictably, the Melbourne weather continued to be unpredictable.

The second week commenced in opposite fashion to the previous week, with the extreme heat guidelines enforced! We batted first in difficult conditions and posted a score of 7/64 from our 20 overs. Highlights included Dot (10no) and Adelaide and Ava facing nearly 30 balls each. Unfortunately, the eventual grand finalists were too strong for us, passing the score without losing a wicket.

Our tournament finished where it started, back at Oak Park against the other NWMCA. We bowled first and there were many great bowling efforts, including Brooke taking her first wicket of the tournament (2/11), as well as many great fielding efforts. Whilst our energy was great, the other team batted well and finished 2/164. After a long week of cricket, the challenge was just a bit beyond us and we were bowled out for 24. Brooke was awarded the fielding award.

Following the final game, a small presentation took place with Molly awarded the most consistent player and Adelaide winning the endeavour award.

While results didn't quite go our way, the tournament was by no means a failure. It was always going to be a challenging tournament as the only "Rookie" team in the competition. For the majority of our team this was their first experience of playing representative cricket, so the focus was on development. The improvement throughout the carnival was immense and all our players should be congratulated on their performances.

VMCU U14 JULIE SAVAGE SHIELD COACH'S REPORT

If you build it, they will come. When nominations were called for U14 Junior Girls to play for NWMCA in the Julie Savage Shield, 47 girls names were put forward seeking selection. Even though YPL had been postponed, the number of nominations highlighted the strength of junior girls' cricket in the northwest. With Shelley as our coordinator and Covid check in officer, Sonja, Kathryn and I commenced a Covid compliant process of putting the girls through their trials in groups of 10 over several weeks. Enthusiasm, nervousness and making new friends was all part of the process.

Whilst NWMCA's request to enter a second team did not eventuate, I am confident that two competitive teams could have been selected.

The list of 47 nominations was eventually shaped down to a squad of 11.

Holly, Honey, Amelia, Allegra, Charli, Sienna, Honor, Inakshi, Indigo, Chelsea and Nikita.

After the team had been announced, we were able to hold 2 training sessions before everyone took a small break from cricket over Xmas.

On the 2nd of January we reassembled for the cap presentation with Holly being announced as captain and Honey and Amelia as Vice Captains. The players looked great in their uniforms, (after a bit of swapping) and everyone ready for a start just 2 days later.

Well we thought we were ready for a start. Monday morning. Arrive at ground. Opposition arrive. Umpires arrive. Rain decides to join in the party and no play today.

Tuesday and we travel down to Dandenong. Rain also turns up. Umpires not keen on playing but 22 keen cricketers let the coaches know to 'give the weather a chance'. After 30 minutes delay, a toss was held, Dandenong sent into bowl and the tournament was officially underway, at the exact same time as it started raining again. Never fear, the game went on in a slight drizzle, with Dandenong reaching 6/80 after 20 overs with our team getting three run outs. Our turn to bat, with the rain starting to threaten to come down heavier, we finished with 4/88 from 15 overs with Honey making 23 and Holly 19. It was nice to start off with a win.

Wednesday and we head to Ringwood and played on a well-prepared oval. Ringwood District made 7/146 from their 30 overs and it was up to us to chase it down. Honey nailed the bowling with 4/10 from her 4 overs. With the bat we made a great start with Honey and Charli getting 32 each, Holly 26 but we had a bit of a wobble as the opposition bowled well for a middle order hat-trick. Nikita and Indigo settled the innings, taking us across the line to win the game at 5/147 in the 26th over. 2 from 2 – a nice start.

Thursday was meant to be a rest day, however it gave us a chance to catch up on Round 1, this time back at our home ground in Oak Park against Box Hill Reporter (footnote – they beat us in last year's final). Never underestimate your opposition and do your best. Well we did very well – posting a score of 3/226 from our 30 overs, with runs to Holly (40), Amelia (36), Honey (36) and Indigo (28). We then bowled them out for 68 in the 22nd over with 2 wickets each to Honor and Amelia.

By this stage of the competition, the team was coming together both on the field, supporting and playing for each other, interacting and forming new bonds and friendships.

I'd like to acknowledge our primary wicketkeepers – Honor and Chelsea. They both showed great glovework behind the stumps. The step up in bowling speeds from club cricket is noticeable and both Honor and Chelsea should be commended on their performances – well done.

Round 4 and we head to Western Region. Due to the close proximity to the northwest, many of our players knew the opposition. We batted first and got some healthy runs on the board, finishing with 4/169. 36 to Honey, 32 to Charli and 25 to Amelia and we thought we had a defendable total. But not to be, Western were up the challenge and chased us down with 10 balls and 2 wickets in hand, so a pretty close result. 2 wickets to Charli and Nikita being the pick of the bowlers.

We had the weekend off, returning Monday for Round 5, back at Oak Park against Ferntree Gully. The team again batted well, posting a total of 3/168 – Holly (58), Amelia (26) Sienna (13) and Indigo (13) being the top run scorers. Our bowlers applied the pressure and we bowled them out in the 20th over for 54, with 3 wickets to Honey and 2 to Inakshi.

Round 6 – the final round before finals and with a final's berth seemingly assured, a game took us by surprise. Playing Inner Southeast, who had only won one game, showed us how close the competition was. They bowled us out for 66, before going on to make 2/144. It was a great reminder to not let your guard down, and it was a very nervous wait as we waited for other results to come in and ladder positions confirmed. But not to worry – 2nd place on the ladder meant we played 3rd place Western in the semi-final – on our home ground this time.

With a day's rest, our team turned up ready to play, and play they did. Restricting Western to all out for 129 in the 24th over allowed us to bat sensibly to get the runs, chasing the total down in the 21st over – not losing a wicket along the way – with great knocks to Holly (41) Charli (37) and Honey (25). Semi final down, grand final here we come.

With 2 days rest, we travelled to South East to play them in the grand final. Bowling first, we held them to 7/144 from their 30 overs, a total that was not beyond us. Great bowling from Sienna and Nikita with 2 wickets each. But credit to South East – they bowled well and made it hard for us to score runs and they took a strong upper hand. Indigo was not going to give up without a fight and took the game deep, finishing unbeaten on 21 off 53 balls, well supported by Honor – 7 off 26 balls and Allegra 4 off 26 balls. The effort by Honor and Allegra supporting Indigo was tremendous, but not quite enough and our last wicket fell leaving us 14 runs behind. Congratulations to South East, they played a great game.

I would like to thank Sonja and Shellee and the NWMCA community for allowing me to coach this team, whilst the tournament only ran for 2 weeks, I will remember it fondly for a long time to come. A great bunch of young cricketers, all with different skills, personalities and ambitions came together to form a great team, not doubt they will also take many fond memories away.

Thanks to Sonja and Shellee – the driving forces behind our rep teams, your organisation and preparation made my job easy.

Thanks to my son Zac, he scored every innings – adding Livescore to his skillset, which I am sure was appreciated by those unable to be at the game.

Thanks to our super organised team manager Sam, with regular updates to our parents and players, interacting with the opposition officials and umpires and keeping us in line, a super job.

Thanks to my fellow selector – Kathryn. Kathryn went on to coach the U12 Rookies and her insights into junior girls' cricket was very helpful in the team selection process.

Thanks to our parents and supporters. Your willingness to trust me to coach the team is greatly appreciated. I hope each of your children feel the experience of playing the tournament has not only made them a better cricketer, but also a more confident young teenager.

I would like to acknowledge the more than 30 players who tried out but were not selected. I hope you took some things away from the trial sessions that you have worked on to improve and when the process starts again next season, you come back and give it another go.

Thank you to the team. Each and every one of you can be extremely proud of how you represented yourselves, your home clubs and the NWMCA. I look forward to seeing you develop in whatever you choose to do – whether you continue your cricket journey and or otherwise.

VMCU U18 CATHRYN FITZPATRICK SHIELD COACH'S REPORT

The 11 girls who represented the NWMCA U18 Girls in this year's inaugural Cathryn Fitzpatrick Shield had a very successful carnival eventually finishing runner's up to the talented Inner South East Cricket Association.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, this year's YPL competition was cancelled, so this was the main carnival for showcasing the upcoming junior talent. We, like all other participants, had limited preparation so it was very important to develop a sense of camaraderie and 'team first' attitude as soon as possible. I felt by the third game this had come to fruition. We didn't get a chance to all train at the same time due to other cricket commitments and COVID, so it was 'training on the run'. Something that shouldn't be overlooked with this team is the fact that more than half of the team were still young enough to play U16.

Samohn Hereora and **Bridie Groves** were named Captain and Vice-captain respectively and did an outstanding job both by helping me gel the girls together quickly. Their leadership and cricket smarts on the field were years ahead of their age as both are still U16.

We played 5 'home and away' games beginning on the 4th of January 2021 and two finals with the Grand Final being played on the 15th of January. That was 7 games in the space of 11 days, and not having a 12th man showed the resilience of this young group. Not one of them complained about being sore or tired which is a credit to each and every one of them.

The team had a stronger bowling side than batting, which meant that we were in a better position getting the runs on the board first, then defend the total that they could muster. Highlights in the batting were **Samohn's 61 n.o.** against Ferntree Gully/Eastern and **Bridie Groves 45 n.o.**, **Hannah Flood's 33 n.o.** against Ringwood and 34 in the Grand Final, plus **Hannah Brne's** consistent mid 20's-30s throughout the carnival. In that same game, **Aarzu Mavi 2/2**, **Abbey Boorman 2/4** and **Brooke Karvelis 2/5** bowled very well. The pleasing aspect of this group in the field was that every single player who bowled took a wicket and every fielder took a catch or contributed to a run-out.

Leading wicket takers were **Aarzu Mavi 8** (2nd in the comp with 9 being the winner), **Bridie Groves** and **Amy Hoang** with 6 wickets apiece also. We had strong contributions and bowling spells from **Hannah Flood**, **Mia Oakley** and **Tyler Paredes**. A special mention should also go to **Grace Thompson** who took 1/5 against Ringwood and often held up an end batting when we needed her to.

In the field everyone contributed, but I was impressed especially with **Mia Oakley** and **Brooke Karvelis's** determination. Leading catches went to **Bridie Groves (5)**, **Mia Oakley (4)** and **Amy Hoang (4)**.

Our leading run makers were **Samohn Hereora (147)**, **Bridie Groves (125)**, **Hannah Flood (114)** and **Hannah Brne (102)**.

The highlight of the carnival was defending 97 against Western Junior Region who had a very strong side. Twice during the carnival they had the better of us and often made scores of 200+. However, during the semi-final against them the team rallied and bowled/fielded exceptionally well to bowl them out for 88 to progress through to the first ever Cathryn Fitzpatrick Grand Final.

Shellee Hereora was the team manager and words cannot express how important she was in getting the team up for each game and the amazing support she was to me as a first year representative coach. Her positive attitude and advanced cricket mind was an enormous help in the success that this team had. Together we felt that each and every player improved over the 2 week carnival. Each player now has specific things or skills to go away and work on.

We would like to say a huge thank you to **Cath Flood** (and family) for not only driving her daughter back and forth from Bendigo for each game but for live cricket scoring and doing such an outstanding job on the pencil throughout the carnival.

DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING REPORT 2020/2021

CHANGES TO LAWS OF CRICKET (2019)

There were no amendments to the Laws of Cricket for season 2020/21.

COVID-19 RULES

NWMCA implemented special rules required by Cricket Victoria to enable cricket to be played. These rules required training of all umpires to ensure matches complied with the COVID-19 restrictions.

Major COVID-19 alterations implemented by NWMCA were

- (a) all cricket played under One Day match rules
- (b) compulsory sanitising of match ball
- (c) compulsory closure at a set time for the first side's innings
- (d) overs bowled in 10 overs blocks from each end of the pitch
- (e) umpires not to handle players clothing or equipment

NWMCA umpires successfully conducting matches within the restrictions. In principle, consideration should be given to retain the trial rules for compulsory closure cut-off times, bowling overs in 10 overs blocks, and umpires not handling players' clothing.

UMPIRE TRAINING

COVID-19 restrictions on the number of persons permitted at Meetings adversely affected normal Umpires' Meetings. The Under-Age Grades pre-season new umpire training for Cricket Australia's Accreditation was unsatisfactory due to COVID-19 limits on group numbers.

UMPIRE AVAILABILITY AND PERFORMANCE

The COVID19 adversely reduced umpire recruitment in both Seniors and Under-Age grades. The uncertainty for a start date to the season contributed to receiving fewer applications to umpire, especially in the Under-Age Grades.

Senior Grades' appointments were constrained by unusually high unavailability in every round. This resulted in lower grades matches having no umpire.

Continual requests for umpires in lower Grades could not be met. It is of concern the reason provided for these demands was player misconduct in previous matches.

Initially, Luscombe Shield reverted to one umpire per match. This policy was changed after Round 8 to improve the management of Luscombe Shield matches.

Under-Age Grades' appointments generally covered most matches, thanks to umpires being prepared to umpire both Friday Night and Saturday morning to cover vacancies.

Despite decreased umpire numbers and general uncertainty for the continuation of the season, the Clubs appeared satisfied with overall umpire performance. Reports submitted by Clubs over the Finals series suggest umpires met the expectations of participants in all Grades.

WOMEN'S SOCIAL T/20 GRADES

Umpires were provided to all Women's Social T/20 Grades which expanded to 5 Grades. Different rules applying to Women's Grades challenged umpires but umpires adapted well and Clubs' reports show Women players appreciated the presence of an umpire to assist player development and the understanding of Laws and Rules.

To provide an umpire to each match we appointed both senior and junior panel umpires to the Women's competitions. The regular availability of the following umpires was invaluable: Tony Arcaro, Jackson Groves-Koelman, Alexander Hudson, Olivia Brock. Luke Talone and Ryan Zammit.

VMCU CARNIVAL MATCHES

Extra NWMCA teams in the VMCU Carnival required NWMCA to fill 85 matches.

Mark Winkle (8), Gordon Andrews (6) and Jackson Groves-Koelman (5) filled the most appointments.

Selected umpires from the Junior panel are invited to officiate in VMCU matches.

The most appointed to matches was Sachin Iyer (4).

Other Junior umpires appointed were: Ethan Curwood, Eve Sheehan, Jordan di Sipio, Jordan Hudson, Leanne Netto, Luke Matthews, Riley Egan, and Ryan O'Connor.

Mark Winkle was appointed to a Grand Final by the VMCU organisers.

UNDER AGE UMPIRE AWARD - TERRY SCOTT MEDAL

Daniel Nettleton was selected for the Terry Scott Medal, awarded to the umpire adjudged the best Under Age umpire for season 2020/21. Daniel umpired 15 matches including the Under 16(1) Friday Night Grand Final

ERIC KELLY

Eric Kelly assisted with the administration of our umpire panels. Eric presented to umpires the common match-day complexities which occasionally arise from the Laws of Cricket. After the 2019/20 season, Eric retired from Cricket Victoria Premier cricket after 35 seasons (487 Premier matches) to umpire NWMCA cricket.

TREASURER'S REPORT – 2020-2021

It is with much pleasure that I submit the Financial Report for Season 2020-2021, inclusive of the Independent Auditor's Report for the year ended 30 June 2020.

At the time of publishing, the Independent Auditor is scheduled to undertake the financial audit for the year ended 30 June 2021 on 22 July 2021, with his report expected shortly thereafter. That report will be made available to all clubs upon receipt and will be published with the Annual Report for Season 2021-2022.

I extend my sincere thanks to all club officials for their continued support and collaboration throughout the season to ensure the effective financial performance of your Association.

Despite the uncertainty and challenges presented to all prior to the commencement of Season 2020-2021, your Association achieved an unplanned Net Surplus of \$35,986.35. This result includes:

- Unbudgeted, abnormal income of \$10,349.09;
- \$7,474.50 of royalty income relating to the previous season; and
- Lower than budgeted operating costs, especially due to greater use of video-conferencing.

Accordingly, on an adjusted basis your Association performed marginally above the season's budget and this result is:

- Reflective of new clubs continuing to join your Association across the men, women and junior competitions;
- Reinforced by the continued growth in female cricket across all ages and levels;
- Inclusive of the effects of the transition to Dukes cricket balls and the managed consumption of stock-on-hand via the progressive reduction in the number of cricket ball types in use; and
- Exclusive of planned expenditure on club first aid training which has been further delayed due to restrictions relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Thus, the post balance date result is expected to be as planned.

Importantly, your Association continues to maintain an appropriate level of liquidity as reflected by the working capital elements as detailed on the Statement of Financial Position.

Finally, you will note that your Association continues to be in a sound financial position, and, your Board continues to work tirelessly at providing fiscal prudence across all of its activities, as well as identifying value-add services for clubs in the future, especially given the continuing COVID-19 environment. To this final point, I extend all best wishes and good health.
